

29.06.2004 | Volga-Dnepr Group gets support from HSBC for the launch of its new scheduled cargo airline

HSBC Bank has granted Volga-Dnepr Group a US\$14 million loan, to be repaid over a five and a half year period.

The loan is to finance the fleet expansion of the first Russian scheduled cargo airline, AirBridge Cargo. The new company will operate both Russian and Western-manufactured freighters.

The first AirBridge Cargo Boeing 747-200 aircraft has already entered into service and the second aircraft is scheduled to arrive by the end of July 2004. Moreover, Volga-Dnepr is currently carrying on negotiations on financing the lease of an IL-76 and a TU-204.

As well as the loan for the new aircraft purchase, HSBC has also provided a short-term credit line up to \$15 million to increase the Volga-Dnepr Group's working capital.

Commented Alexey Isaikin, President of Volga-Dnepr Group; "AirBridge Cargo, created within Volga-Dnepr Group, has become the first and sole carrier in the world that provides its customers with unique combination of AN-124s and B747s – the two best freighters of the present – which soon will be supplemented with smaller aircraft, such as IL-76s, IL-96s and TU-204s. We hope that our fruitful cooperation with HSBC in realizing our concept of 'airlift supermarket' will continue."
